Attendance at school -

Term 4 attendance overall= 95.1%

In Term 4 we had an increase in persistent absenteeism to 12.9%. I have investigated this increase and found this to primarily be made up of children who are arriving late to school. A reminder that the school day starts at 8.45am and any child arriving after 8.50am when the side gate is locked will be marked as late. Studies have shown that children who become persistent absentee children have their academic chances in life reduced.

The subject lead has begun the work with the Maths Hub on Readiness for Mastery

Sun Safety



As I write this, I am currently looking out the window thinking – finally the summer may have begun!!

Please can you ensure that your child has sunscreen applied to them before they come to school (even if it looks overcast outside) and if appropriate has sun cream to top up with through the day – under safeguarding rules staff are not permitted to apply sun cream to any child, under any circumstance. School provides every child with a legionnaire (neck covering) hat and so they are not permitted to wear their own caps.

I remain optimistic for the continuation of the good weather.

Sickness/diarrhoea

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If your child does have a bout of either (or both!) please ensure that he/she is kept at home **until 48 hours after the last occurrence**. **Head lice**

We will probably never be free of these little irritating creatures, but if everyone checks the heads of **all** family members regularly and treats with a commercial product or by regular combing through with a lice comb, we can try our best to be head lice free. We will continue our practice of contacting the parents of any child who is seen by staff to have head lice to ask that the child be collected from school and treated. Please don't be embarrassed if you get the phone call – head lice are a problem everyone has had to deal with at some time or another.
