School Development Update

Improvement priority 24-25	Progress against priorities
To strengthen opportunities for pupils to use and apply their mathematical skills to ensure they meet Age Related Expectations for each year aroup.	Children's outcomes in teacher's assessments show that children are making steady progress in using and applying their mathematical skills being taught to them. We hope that the new introduction with supporting Mathematical mindset will continue to show further improvement in this too.
To reduce persistent absenteeism (<90%) to be in line or lower than National average – school target of 10%	We are still not below the national average of persistent absenteeism, with this term rising to 11.3%. The Family Liaison Support Worker will be contacting the families of those pupils who are concerning us. The whole year picture shows a higher percentage than we would like of 12.6%
To induct a new Maths Subject lead with a focus on monitoring, target setting and reviewing that will improve and develop standards	The subject lead has continued to work with the Maths Hub on Readiness for Mastery programme. We have completed and planned in further training for staff and have seen an improvement in the children's approach to Maths change over the year, we will be focusing on Maths mindset and looking at ways we can share some of these techniques with parents for you to support this with your children at home as well.
To maintain an effective and purposeful assessment system for the foundation subjects	Staff continue to work well in using their assessments in foundation subjects to develop a whole picture of a child's achievements and their areas for development. The assessments are being made on every subject taught. We are continuing to look, this term, at ways of incorporating this into your child's end of year report for you as well.

Attendance at school -

Term 5 attendance overall= 96.8%



In Term 5 we had a slight decrease in persistent absenteeism to **11.3%**, which is higher than we would like it to be. I have investigated this and found that this is still due to too many pupils arriving late to school. A reminder that the school day starts at **8.45am** and any child arriving after 8.50am when the side gate is locked will be marked as late. Studies have shown that children who become persistent absentee children have their academic chances in life reduced.

All our lessons begin at 8.50am and so those that are arriving after that are missing vital learning – even if it is just 5 minutes, they can take up to a further 10 minutes to be ready to learn. A child who misses 15mins a day misses 48hrs and 45mins over the course of an academic year.

Breakfast club - 8am every day



Just a reminder that the school is now running a breakfast club. Children must be booked in and paid for in advance. Reminders for Parents

Sun Safety



As I write this, I am currently looking out the window thinking when will the summer begin!!

Please can you ensure that your child has sunscreen applied to them before they come to school (even when it looks overcast outside) and if appropriate has sun cream to top up with through the day – under safeguarding rules staff are not permitted to apply sun cream to any child, under any circumstance.

School provides every child with a legionnaire (neck covering) hat and so they are not permitted to wear their own caps. I remain optimistic for good weather to arrive.

If your child does have a bout of either (or both!) please ensure that he/she is kept at home **until 48 hours after the last occurrence**. Head lice

We will probably never be free of these little irritating creatures, but if everyone checks the heads of **all** family members regularly and treats with a commercial product or by regular combing through with a lice comb, we can try our best to be head lice free. We will continue our practice of contacting the parents of any child who is seen by staff to have head lice to ask that the child be collected from school and treated. Please don't be embarrassed if you get the phone call – head lice are a problem everyone has had to deal with at some time or another.
