School Development Update

We continue to make good progress towards our priorities this year:

School closure – just in case!



In the very rare circumstances that I may have to take the decision to close the school, we will try very hard to ensure you get the information about this as soon as is possible.

You will receive an email notification and a text message informing you of my decision. It will also be published on our school website.

Our closure will also be published on LCC's school closure website, and we will notify local radio stations.

If in doubt, please keep checking your emails and mobile phone, you may not be able to speak to anyone at school if you telephone.

Improvement priority 25-26	Progress against priorities
To embed the use of manipulatives across all year groups that supports progression towards abstract representations to allow for improved outcomes for all children.	Children have access to high quality manipulatives and are using these to support their learning and understanding well. Access to targeted support is quicker and addressing misconceptions, the impact of this has been the children are showing more understanding of mathematical concepts.
To further develop the assessments in foundation subjects so that clearly articulate the knowledge and skills learnt and there is an evidence bank to support teacher judgement.	Book looks have shown that there is some evidence of retained knowledge within the topic books, we are working on consistency across the school and that we have strong evidence to support our judgements.
To build a professional development pathway for staff to deepen their expertise in adaptive teaching and SEND.	The training completed so far this year, has not only refreshed and upskilled our staff but enhanced the quality of the support given to children throughout the school, not just those with SEND. Additional resources have been introduced within classrooms to support this training.

Attendance at school –

Term 2 attendance overall= 96.5%



Again, a reminder that the school day starts at 8.45am and any child arriving after 8.50am when the side gate is locked will be marked as late. In Term 2 we still had too many children arriving at school late, with 14.3% of the school being late to school at least once. **All our lessons begin promptly at 8.50am and so those that are arriving after that are missing vital learning.**

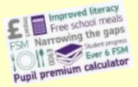


Oak class mobile phones

If your child is in Oak class and they walk home, they are permitted to bring a mobile phone into school which **MUST** be handed into the office.

Your child should not be bringing their phone into school if they are collected by car from outside of the building.

Health

Sickness/diarrhoea

If your child does have a bout of either (or both!) please ensure that he/she is kept at home **until 48 hours after the last occurrence**. We appreciate that this can be very inconvenient, if you are a working parent, but it is essential to ensure we reduce the spread of infections.

Head lice

We will probably never be free of these little irritating creatures, but if everyone checks the heads of **all** family members regularly and treats with a commercial product or by regular combing through with a lice comb, we can try our best to be head lice free.

We will continue our practice of contacting the parents of any child who is seen by staff to have head lice to ask that the child be collected from school and treated. Please don't be embarrassed if you get the phone call – head lice are a problem everyone has had to deal with at some time or another.

Absence from school

If your child is unwell and must be absent, please telephone us as early as possible. You may leave a message on the answering machine, send an email or report via Arbor. Under safeguarding we have a duty to call you to find out why your child is not in school if we have received no indication from you regarding the absence.
