Key knowledge

- Know that climate zones are places on earth that share similar weather and temperature
- The main climate zones are tropical, arid/dry, temperate, Mediterranean, continental, polar, mountain
- Biomes are climate zones that share certain animals and plants
- The main biomes are ice, tundra, desert, grassland, savannah, rainforest, temperate, boreal
- Vegetation belts describe the types of plants that exist in a biome
- The main vegetation belts are forests, grasslands, tundras, deserts and ice sheets
- Amazonas State is located in Brazil. It has a tropical climate

Vocabulary

Biome - the plants and animals that exist in a particular type of environment.

Climate - the long-term weather conditions of an area.
climate zone - an area that has a distinct climate.

Deforestation - the cutting down or burning of trees for wood or to use the land.

Equator - an imaginary line that runs round the centre of the globe at an equal distance between the North and South Poles

human features - features of our world that have been made by humans.

Indigenous Peoples - people from a particular place whose ancestors lived there for a long time before others arrived.

physical features - features of our world that are natural.

region - a geographic area or division of land that has certain human or physical features.

rural - connected with or like the countryside.

settlement - an area of land where people live and work.

state - an area within a country that has its own government.

urban - connected with a town or city.

vegetation belt - the plant life within a biome.
